With the goal of achieving self-sufficiency and self-sustainability in food production, our projects and initiatives include building greenhouses, supporting wheat cultivation, and distributing heavy and light agricultural equipment, such as tractors and farming nutrients, to farmers in Yemen.

Providing development and technical solutions to overcome challenges will increase production efficiency and help sustain income for fishermen. SDRPY projects in this sector generate job opportunities, empower fishing communities, and boost the local economy.

From how the cyclones ruined their primary source of income to the joys of receiving SDRPY's motorized fishing boats, our development specialists work with fishermen to enable and empower them and improve their livelihood and standards of living.

Promoting Well-being and Improving Healthcare Services

Our projects, initiatives, and programs provide economic, social, and development solutions that help improve the quality of healthcare services provided to children, women, men, and Yemenis of all ages and backgrounds.

We believe that access to adequate healthcare is a fundamental human right. Thus, our projects in the health sector aim to improve the efficiencies of hospitals and medical centers, enhance the quality of healthcare services, and increase access to healthcare facilities. Besides equipping hospitals with modern medical equipment, rehabilitating and expanding current medical centers, our programs also target medical cadres' development by providing needed training to strengthen their capabilities.

Improving Energy Efficiency



The improvement of energy generation and efficiency reflects positive economic and social outcomes. Our projects range from providing oil derivatives to power plants to establishing power stations across Yemen.

The Saudi Oil Derivatives Grant to Yemen has made it possible for 80 power stations to fully and continuously operate, generating, in return, constant and stable energy that is powering homes, hospitals, and schools.

Our initiatives and programs include supplying Yemeni governorates with power generators and establishing new power stations to improve energy generation and distribution.

Increasing Access to Education and Creating Learning Opportunities

Through our development projects and initiatives, we at SDRPY aspire to create a brighter future for the children and young people in Yemen by increasing access to education and promoting equal access for all.

Almahra received several SDRPY school buses, which helped encourage parents to send their daughters to schools. These buses were a fundamental reason for the enrollment of a 12 year old village girl in school for the first time in her life. Thus, no project is considered small when the impact is monumental to families across Yemen.

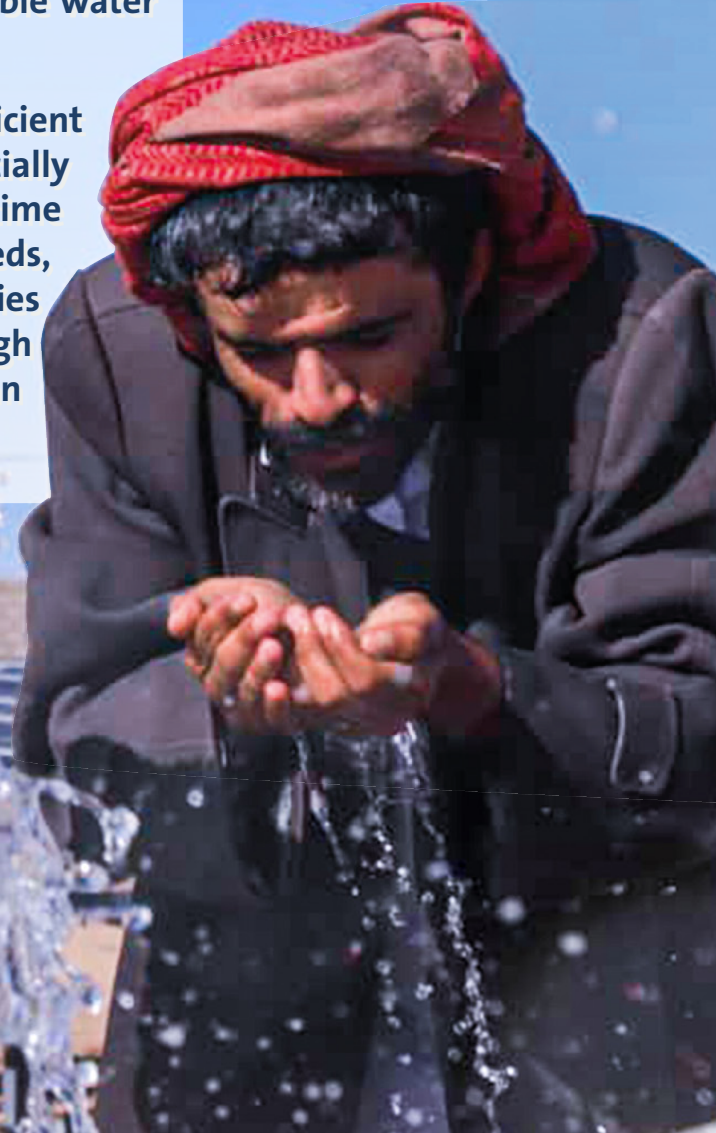

Access to Clean Water

Some Yemenis are forced to drink sea water due to the scarcity of clean water in a number of areas. Lately, we were able to provide sustainable water resources to those in need.

Moreover, the lack of access to sufficient drinking water has led poor families, especially women and children, to spend a lot of time fetching clean water. To meet their needs, we work to deliver adequate water supplies by providing safe drinking water through water trucks, tanks or by drilling artesian wells.

Safety First

We are keen on securing international safety standards that are consistent with the requirements of the international navigation systems by supplying heavy equipment intended for building roads and helping people in tropical crises, and distributing ambulances, firetrucks, and public transportation buses. Stories from Yemen

Abundant Production

Residents of Hajjah governorate suffer from a serious agricultural production problem in which the crops are grown either rotten or poisonous, which affected farmers income negatively. 70% of Yemeni people rely on agriculture as a source of income. To end this dilemma, SDRPY provided air-conditioned greenhouses to those farmers. “Thanks to SDRPY, I start my day by irrigating crops that I successfully planted in the greenhouses that include techniques to protect my crops. Now we eat vegetables, and are able to supply markets and low-income villagers” Ahmed said (a farmer from Hajjah). He expressed his appreciation by saying “such agricultural projects build capacities and increase awareness.” **Thus, Ahmed now spends his days happily irrigating and harvesting his vegetables.**



Stories from Yemen

Abdulrahman is recovering well

Abdulrahman, an elementary school student, suffered kidney failure due to medical neglect. His deteriorating health affected his way of living, including his school performance. While he recovered well after treatment, his health deteriorated again in 2018 due to a lack of medical guidance. With toxins accumulating in his body and specialized treatment equipment no longer operating in Aden. Abdulrahman soon went into a coma. Shortly, SDRPY launched a program equipping the dialysis center at Al-Jumhuriyah Hospital in Aden. With the presence of the new equipment, Abdulrahman's health has improved. **We at the SDRPY wish Abdulrahman a speedy recovery and anticipate his return to school very soon.**

Small Projects with Large Impacts

To live 12 years without attending school is abnormal, but it was a situation a Yemeni girl found herself in. She was raised in a remote village where the nearest school is 10 km away. Due to the distance and unsafe roads when going to school, her parents decided not to let her go to school for her own safety. Finally, a school bus provided by SDRPY passed by her village, that is when her parents got excited to see a safe transportation that **will give their daughter a chance to attend school for the first time in 12 years, which resulted in encouraging the residents to let their children attend school and have equal access to education.**
