






# Peace and Stability are the Basis for Sustainable Development in Yemen








#### **Our Offices in Yemen**

### Al Ghaydah Power Plant, Al Mahrah Governorate:



Execution of civil and electrical works in the power generation plant



### **Project Objectives**

Raising electricity generation capabilities with high reliability and low economical cost

### **Project Description**

Installation of 10 generators of 1 megawatt capacity for each generator, 5 transformers of 3 megawatts of voltage for each transformer, 3 ring-connecting units and an electrical circuit breaker panel of 11 cells, with the construction of bases for all the aforementioned supplies and a cable duct that includes the supply of cables and terminal ends, as well as the installation of an earthing network for them and the renovation of the main panels room and providing it with air conditioning.












# King Salman Medical and Educational City Project, Al Mahrah Governorate







# Water is Life

In an area where clean, safe drinking water is scarce, Yemenis depend on salty sea water to meet their everyday needs. However, through recent water management projects, we were able to obtain clean and drinkable water sources. SDRPY projects contribute to the delivery of sufficient water supplies to meet people's needs, despite the land's unique nature. Therefore, water is delivered by methods appropriate for each region; for rugged areas, the water is delivered through tanks. However, if the geographical environment allows well-drilling, then wells are drilled to provide families sustain access to clean water. Because access to clean water is a development priority that is directly relevant to the quality of life, such projects are integral as they meet the needs of residents and reduce the suffering of women and children.






