The Saudi Development and Reconstruction Program for Yemen (SDRPY)

The Saudi Development and Reconstruction Program for Yemen (SDRPY) was established in May 2018 through a royal decree from the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud. Given the earlier international experiences in the development of Yemen, SDRPY's development strategy was created with the aim of meeting the needs of the people of Yemen, providing institutional, technical, and logistical support to Yemen. The Program is operated under a comprehensive development agreement between the governments of Saudi Arabia and Yemen, and is an extension of the Kingdom's efforts to move the support from humanitarian relief to that of efficient, effective, and sustainable development. Accordingly, SDRPY focuses on providing sustainable economic and development support for Yemen across various sectors, implementing development projects and programs aimed at strengthening and developing essential services, developing the infrastructure, creating job opportunities, capacity-building of Yemeni government institutions , enhancing the Yemeni government's capacity to absorb loans and development grants and enriching the Yemeni government's capacity to adhere to the highest standards of governance The Program collaborates with several partners at the local, regional, and international levels. SDRPY partners include the Yemeni government and non-government agencies, ministries, development funds, local authorities in Yemeni governorates, and various regional and international development organizations and agencies. On the ground, the Program serves a variety of Yemeni governorates across eight vital sectors, including, health, education, transportation, energy, water, agriculture, fisheries, enhancing and strengthening government capabilities. Through SDRPY offices in Yemen, the program implements comprehensive and effective development projects and programs to meet the needs of the people of Yemen. Additionally, the presence of local offices enables SDRPY to follow up and supervise it s work directly, study the needs on the ground, and report on project progress. Also, SDRPY's local team assists in addressing development challenges and identifying appropriate and sustainable development solutions based on the impact and implications of projects, programs, activities, and initiatives on the people of Yemen.

SDRPY Laid the Foundation Stone for Water Security Enhancement Project Using Renewable Energy in Aden

The Saudi Development and Reconstruction Program for Yemen (SDRPY) has launched a project to enhance water security using renewable energy in Aden Governorate. The project will directly benefit at least 800,000 Yemenis living in various districts of Aden. The project will sustainably increase the amount of potable water pumped by utilizing renewable energy. It will enhance the efficiency of water resource management in the field, train workers in the maintenance and use of solar energy.



SDRPY Launches Development Projects in Marib Governorate, Yemen

The SDRPY laid the foundation stone for a series of development projects in Marib Governorate. These projects include establishing a college of medicine, a girls' educational complex, and a project for enhancing water resources.

The launch ceremony was overseen by Marib's governor and Member of the Presidential Leadership Council, Maj. General Sultan Al-Arada, Yemeni Prime Minister Ahmed Awad bin Mubarak and Yemeni Ministers

SDRPY Inaugurates Five Model Schools in Shabwah, Abyan, Lahij, Al-Dhale, and Taiz Governorates

The Saudi Development and Reconstruction Program for Yemen (SDRPY) today inaugurated five model schools in

the governorates of Shabwah, Abyan, Lahij, Al-Dhale, and Taiz. The schools join the model schools established by the program across various governorates in Yemen, supporting education and learning opportunities in the country. SDRPY's projects and initiatives in the education sector have supported public education, high education and technical and vocational training.





With the aim of enhancing the capacities of the health sector across Yemen, SDRPY launched an emergency and critical medical services support project by delivering four well-equipped ambulances, complete with all the necessary medical equipment, in the presence of Mr. Mohammed Ali Yasser, Governor of AlMahrah Governorate. This support is provided through SDRPY's ongoing efforts in the health sector.






Projects and initiatives
